MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October's meeting featured a "Two-Fur". We started the with Stan Jennings historical visit with the Salt Lake Garfield and Western Railroad. The infamous "Saltair" Route. Stan led us through the long and interesting journey from inception to present day with thorough presentation.





Peter Lieber introduced the members to developing a layout plan with the use of selective compression and Google Maps. The Bernina Express is a train connecting Chur (or Davos) in Switzerland to Poschiavo and Tirano in Italy by crossing the Swiss Edgadin Alps. For most of its journey, the train also runs along the World Heritage Site known as the Rhaetian Railway in the Albula / Bernina Landscapes. Peter was able to give us a view of railroading that many of us never have a chance to see. European modeling is both fascinating and beautiful. This line in Switzerland is the only railroad that I know of that you can travel via Google Maps.

December 20, 2014 - PAINTING BASICS - Presented by Blaine Holbrook

Are you tired of seeing and/or buying look-a-like models? Most of us want to have unique models and that usually requires paint.

Does painting in general seem mysterious or difficult? Does airbrushing in particular seem mysterious to you? It shouldn't.

The December 20, 2014 meeting of the Northern Utah Division will feature a clinic on painting basics. While the emphasis will be on air brush basics, we will also work on the basics of safety, surface preparation, paint types, brush painting, dry brushing, masking, paint removal, and many other related subjects. If you have any painting-related subject you feel should be part of the clinic, let us know.

We will meet at Blaine Holbrook's home, 500 E. 1000 So. in Centerville, at 2PM. Blaine has superb facilities for this type of clinic -- a good area for the classroom necessities, a huge lab area (two floors) and plenty of parking available in a church parking lot behind the house. We could handle forty participants, although twenty would be much easier.

Like a race school, we will present basics in a classroom-like manner, then on to really painting, both brush and airbrush. Blaine has a friend, Alan Eaton, who is a master air brush artist, he will help with the hands-on air brushing segment. The 2PM starting time gives about an hour for basics then two-three hours for serious practice (we don't have to quit exactly at the normal five).

There will be a sign up sheet passed around at the November meeting. Please do not be embarrassed if you do not have any of the equipment mentioned on the list, the question is intended to indicate how many could need to borrow airbrushes, etc. so we have an adequate number on hand. Also, if you have a non-working airbrush, bring it, it can probably be returned to working condition.



The contest at Wasatch Rails was a good experience for me. I really enjoyed looking at the models entered and seeing all the details in them. I am especially grateful to Rick Luther for his assistance and the others that provided guidance. When not too many models were checked in Friday night, I decided to bring a few of mine that I thought might not be ready to have judged. (The next day I was happy to see there were more entered.) I was glad I brought them because I was able to earn enough points to earn a few merit awards towards my AP certificates! I wasn't expecting that outcome but I'm glad I brought them. It reminds me a little of the experience I shared last month that happened to me many years ago.







The highlight for me was the Parking Garage model by Robert Arnesen. Robert has been modeling for quite a few years but just recently joined the NMRA. He is part of the N scale club and has several modules. One can tell he knows what he is doing and I am glad he is going for his Structures AP Certificate! It is models like his that inspire me to do better and I want to use some of his techniques. What really gets me is that I didn't even realize it was N scale until the next day! The whole time I was looking at it there was so much detail and it all fit together so well as a scene (even though it was just one structure) that I didn't notice it wasn't HO which is what I'm used to looking at.

One thing he did was to add a mirror on the back wall inside. It's really creative because it then made it a "whole" structure on the inside and from the outside you wouldn't know it was "less than whole"! It works perfectly. It got the most AP points in scoring and deserves the title Best in Show!

Even if you don't plan to enter a contest (you can get your AP certificate without entering a contest; some of the structures just have to be judged) I urge you to look at the models in detail. You can learn a lot from them that can help you be a better modeler yourself. If you get a chance to talk to the modeler of a particular model you like, even better! It will help encourage that person to know they did a good job and will inspire them to keep working hard. Take time to bring something to the Division Meeting to share. It's fun to see what others have done and that way we can enjoy the journey together!


