Achievement Program





I'm not one to make "New Year's Resolutions" because I think one should always be improving one's self. However, when the opportunity presents itself I like to "resolve" to do better at a given subject.

Such an opportunity presented itself or rather I took a little extra time when I had an urge, to start a scratch build project to begin a journey on a path I had vaguely started down before. For the Cars AP Certificate four out of the eight required cars need to be scratch built. I'm not so much into scratch building as I am craftsman kits. Not that I don't enjoy it. It's just that some of these kits have such great detail and yet still a kit. I don't have to hunt down where to get this and where to get that and that's

with already knowing what it is you want! Here comes the fun part though; after hunting down all those parts and putting them together to make a car you can say, "I built that from scratch!"

Many years ago I bought some supplies to make molds and cast parts. It was cool but not part of an actual project. This time I have a purpose. I've said it before and I will continue to say it, "That's one reason I like the AP Program: to help me focus on a specific area as well as learn new skills I might not have already." Before I used some commercial parts in my molds. This time, especially for the sake of scratch building, I made my own masters. I could have just used the "master" to make the car but I want to make several cars. I have another project I'm working on and the fact that I need a number of cars for it, well, I might as well get my Cars AP Certificate at the

same time! Why not?

I made my master out of wood, styrene and some NBW castings laying around from another kit, and using high strength RTV rubber I made a mold of it. I figured if I made a car frame it could be used for the start of a flat car, box car, gondola and others. I also made a deck out of strip wood and will see about casting that as well as cutting one out on the laser machine. Each version will have some differences and I can see what I like the best. Maybe each car will have a differently made deck. I used a 1-to-1 ratio resin to make the copy but I really want to try casting it with low-temp melting metal. If it's just a flat car it might need more weight to track better but we will see. Any other car I can hide the weight somewhere. Plus, it's something I haven't done yet and want to try it! I couldn't find anything locally so will have to order it. By the way, did I mention I worked on this on and off mostly over the 4 day weekend I had because of the new year? After trips to several different stores I found all I needed, except the metal. At least I was able to get most of the project started. As

far as those detail parts I had to hunt down, well, most are on order and I am anxious to get them.

It's nice to have a few days in a row to work on a project. Where my resolution comes in is to have the patience while waiting for parts and to make the time to finish the cars once the parts have come. The good news is I have a couple of frames cast and am ready to make a flat car, box car, and gondola. I've learned a little more about casting than I did before and am excited to do more. Next month I'll let you know (and share pictures) of how the cars turn out. I might even explain more about the other project I mentioned above. I normally model in HO/HOn3 but this project is in On30. Until then, if you are interested in making molds and casting your own parts, let me know. You might know something I don't and can help me and I will share what I've learned and that way we can enjoy the journey together!

A New Year's Resolution (Challenge)

I am not one for making New Year's resolutions. I've broken more than I've kept. This year will hopefully be different. No more losing weight, drinking less, exercising more or any other of the usual resolutions that hear about this time



of year. This year is about a challenge that I will make to myself. To be a better modeler! Now that sounds like something that I should be able to accomplish. The other types of resolutions can take a great deal of time and commitment to complete and that sounds like something that is more work than fun. I have to work to live, but I don't have to live to work.

So what is my challenge for 2015? To begin the journey on the path for the Achievement Program as outlined by the NMRA. Will I ever become a Master Model Railroader? Who knows? Frankly, who cares? The idea is to challenge myself to become a better artisan at my craft. The title that goes with the ultimate goal does not mean that much to me. It is the journey to get there that means more. After reviewing the guidelines for the initial step for the Golden Spike Award, I spent some time reviewing my layout and rolling stock. So what are the qualifications for achieving the Golden Spike?

- Rolling Stock (Motive Power & Cars):
 - o Display six units of rolling stock either scratchbuilt, craftsman kits or detailed commercial kits.
- Model Railroad Setting (Structures & Scenery):
 - Construct a minimum of eight square feet of layout including scenery.
 - Construct five structures either scratchbuilt, craftsman kits or detailed commercial kits. If a module
 has less than five structures, additional structures separate from the scene may be presented.
- Engineering (Civil & Electrical):
 - Three types of trackage required (e.g. turnout, crossing, crossover, etc.). All must be properly ballasted and installed on proper roadbed. Commercial trackage may be used. All installed trackage must be properly wired so that two trains can be operated simultaneously (e.g. double track main, single track main with sidings, and block or command control).
 - Provide one additional electrical feature such as power operated turnouts, signaling, turnout indication, lighted buildings, etc.

For this article, I'll talk about the first one; **Rolling Stock (Motive Power & Cars)**. After reviewing all of my rolling stock, I came up with five pieces that easily fit into this category with minimal work. The rolling stock I chose, do not have to be in a contest or reach a certain score to be used for the Golden Spike. They just have to show that I did more than open the box and place it on the track. Things such as adding knuckle couplers and making sure they are properly adjusted, adding metal wheels, new paint and/or decals, weathering or any other small changes that you make to the model. Things we do all the time when preparing a model to be added to the layout or for display.



As for the sixth one, I decided that it should be something that would challenge me. At the November 2014 meeting I won a raffle for a Tyco Ralston Purina reefer car. Some would say, "Big deal! It's a cheap toy car that comes with toy train sets." I looked at it and said to myself, "How can I take this 'Toy' and make it into model to be proud of?" This is where the challenge for the New Year begins. My plan is to maintain the "essence" of the car while adding body mounted Kadee couplers, new trucks with metal wheels, details and weathering. Something I hope I will be proud of and not hide in box under the layout.

In future articles I will talk more about this "journey" towards the Golden Spike Award and hopefully inspire some of you to challenge yourself in 2015.




