TIPS FOR A PRESENTATION OR WORKSHOP

Everyone has at least one subject that should be shared with others. Following these general guidelines will help us work up an excellent presentations and workshops.

- 1. Choose a topic. This is surprisingly important.
 - A. Pick a topic of interest for the group.
 - B. Pick a topic you enjoy, want to learn and want to share.
 - C. Pick a topic that can be presented in the time available.
 - D. Do you have to be an expert? NO!! Picking a topic you know nothing about but would like to learn then sharing your new-found knowledge can be very rewarding.

2. Make an outline

- A. What do you want to cover?
- B. Keep items in a logical order.

3. Research

- A. Even if you are an expert in the chosen subject, you will need to do research.
- B. If you picked a topic you know nothing about but would like to learn, good for you!! But you will have to do a lot more research. It will be worth it!!
- C. Nowadays, Google can be very helpful as a guide, be careful using it as a resource.
- D. For our subjects, books and magazines provide a lot of information.
- E. Talking with others will help.
- F. Your experience can be a great resource.
- G. If you don't know a subject, you will have a good idea what needs to be learned.

4. Put together your presentation or workshop

- A. If you are planning a presentation you may use Power Point or a Slide show.
- B. If you are planning a workshop, remember that part of the workshop must be a presentation then plan how the hands-on work will flow.
- C. Handouts are very important whether it is an overview, a complete compilation of the subject or something in-between.

5. PRACTICE!!

- A. Practice at least to yourself, especially at first.
- B. If possible, practice with another person.
- C. Are things flowing in a logical order?

6. MOST IMPORTANT!!

- A. Repeat 2, 3, 4, 5 and possibly 1 as needed until the presentation or workshop flows smoothly.
- B. You will never have a "perfect" presentation. However, following these steps will give you a shot at an excellent presentation.
